happy-go-lucky student into a veteran newspaper man. In a vacuum of other news representation, the news bureau took over the story and sent both the story and pictures world-wide through the press associations and picture syndicates. By this and a few other marginal stories, the news bureau stored up respect and good will with the press associations, which has paid the college almost untold dividends since then, in a number of ways."

Turning from the past to the present: there are four students employed in the news bureau, each of a slightly different status. Jeanne LaLone handles most of the stories on music, such as band concerts, operas, chorus presentations and etc. She also does any correspondence that the director needs sent out, and writes alternates. Claudia Morehouse does mostly alternates and the looking up of home towns and some writing. Sam Blythe does practically all leg-work, running down the necessary stories and angles of stories. Patt Ryan does a little bit of everything, from writing straight stories, alternates, and taking over the office, if Maynard leaves for any reason.

Special jobs for the student help are making up sets, which is a combination of six sheets of paper with five carbons; packing pictures; and writing captions; alternates and straight sets, plus home town specials. Occasionally, they write the original story. They run down stories and run back again to have them checked, if needed before being sent out. Also a supply of envelopes has to be kept up of all the regulars that get sent out daily.

The stories are sent out to any place that they concern, from Pakistan and nearby Rosalia to Timbuctoo. Volumes of various stories, running between one and two thousand a month, are sent out to dailies,
